

# THE PLAYHOUSE PLAY KIT PROJECT

#### Goals

- Mitigate trauma caused by the Pandemic
- Stay connected to families in the community
- Design open-ended, engrossing activities that support development
- Provide an accurate and reassuring child development message
- Support parents

## Activities and Preliminary Numbers from May 2020 to March 2021

- **7 Play Kits for ages 2-6**: Playhouse Care Package, Everybody Let's Go Outside, Water and Wondering, Pizza and More, Autumn Kit, Amazing Animals, and Snowy Days.
- **6 STEAM Kits for ages 6 and up**: Town Engineer, Artistic Chemist, Art in Motion, Let's Explore Light, & Geology Rocks.
- 1 Infant/Toddler Kit for ages 9 to 24 months.
- Each kit contains 6 to 12 activities and enough supplies for at least 2 children.
- 1650 total kits assembled, 1528 distributed as of March 19.
- 87% Watauga residents: 98% of agency recipients and 80% of Playhouse porch recipients were Watauga residents.
- 65% were distributed free of charge to families in financial distress via The Playhouse porch and area agencies (see list).
- 35% of families made "pay what you can" donations ranging from \$10-\$25 to cover the cost of materials.

"We love this... I'm beyond grateful for these. I'm a single mom to a toddler and a special needs teenager. There is stuff for both of them (supervised of course) and stuff we can do as a family." —parent



- 54% of families requesting via The Playhouse reported at least one of the following: Medicaid/EBT, significantly reduced income due to the pandemic, or food insecurity.
- **Spanish activity guides** were promoted through local aid groups and the schools.
